### RATIONALE

Research skills, once the prerogative of academics and a few specialist professionals, are now increasingly useful for managers generally. Consequently, this course, by requiring students to complete a substantial research dissertation, provides basic training and research experience to meet the needs of both business and higher level research studies (eg PhD).

### SYNOPSIS

The Honours degree serves to foster a research ethos and provides opportunities for motivated and high-achieving students to undertake advanced study in a business discipline to produce substantial research dissertations (maximum of 25,000 words). Each candidate for the dissertation is required to submit a research proposal for approval and endorsement prior to the commencement of research. By completing the required research methods course, and by working under the guidance of a supervisor during the course of the dissertation, a student should successfully acquire the appropriate research skills which will allow him/her to undertake research oriented careers and/or doctoral level studies.
