Depending on courses selected, career opportunities may be sought within the disciplines of human resources, marketing, administration, information technology, supply chain management, tourism, small business management, international business or commerce.

Bachelor of Accounting and Sustainable Business

Duration 4 years full-time, up to 9 years part-time

Mode of study On-campus, distance education

Campus Springfield

Entry requirements Year 12 English (4 SA) or equivalent

Program focus

In a world's first, the BASB embeds the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) principles, giving it a true sustainable business focus. The accounting courses provide students with a knowledge-base in financial accounting, management accounting, business law and finance. The sustainable business and environmental science courses equip students with the knowledge and skills to meet the needs of organisations to strategically manage and report their environmental and social impacts on the community as well as provide them with an understanding of the principles and practices associated with carbon accounting and carbon tax/emissions trading systems. In addition, the program provides students with the necessary broad-based administrative and management skills required by organisations to compete in the global economic environment.

Students who have achieved satisfactory results in completing USQ's Bachelor of Accounting and Sustainable Business degree can gain full credit towards the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from City University of Seattle (CityU) in the USA – thereby receiving two degrees from their studies at USQ. Electing to participate in the credit guarantee option from CityU requires no additional academic work and only requires that students apply to CityU at the beginning of their first semester of studies at USQ, and meet certain academic and administrative requirements.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Career opportunities for graduates include: public accountant, chartered accountant, company accountant, carbon accountant, company secretary, financial administrator, government (tax department, audit office, treasury, local government), financial planner, investment adviser, financial institutions (banks, building societies), and forensic accountant.

Professional accreditation

Graduates from this program will meet the educational entrance requirements of CPA Australia, the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia (ICAA) and the National Institute of Accountants (NIA).

Program focus

MAJORS

Administrative Management

This major aims to equip students with the knowledge, skills and attitudes that will enable them to perform a role in the administrative management function of an organisation. It also provides students with management techniques that will assist them to lead and direct people to attain the information-related goals of the organisation. The major also will assist in preparing students for work in the virtual office environment.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates include: administrative professional, executive officer, administrative manager, administrative services manager, RIM (records and information) manager, corporate administration manager.

Human Resource Management

Human Resource Management is about managing people at work. This major covers a broad range of areas, including organisational behaviour and management, staffing and remuneration, workplace health and safety, employment relations, people development, workplace negotiations, strategic human resource management and leading organisational change.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates include: personnel officer, employment officer, training officer, industrial relations officer, safety and welfare officer, human resource manager, and hospitality industry employee.

Information Technology Management

The Information Technology Management major is highly focused on Information Systems (IS) as a key strategic enabler of business success, and teaches students how to leverage IS to identify and solve business problems. The major serves as a pathway into a variety of rapidly emerging IS career paths where business skills, e.g. communication, problem-solving and teamwork, are most important. Information Technology Management students develop skills in electronic commerce, systems analysis, database design and implementation, security, network management, service management and enterprise resource systems. Students study leading-edge business packages and tools, such as Oracle, SAP and ISO2000, and are provided with the opportunity to pursue professional certification in a number of these areas. Students can study the Information Technology Management major in the Bachelor of Information Technology or the Bachelor of Business.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates include: business analyst, systems analyst, data architect, business process/data modeller, enterprise resource planning (ERP) analyst, computer trainer/support, help desk support, IT manager, IT sales and marketing specialist, change manager, business process engineer, IT project manager, consultant, business continuity (BCM) specialist, IT security specialist, service management.

International Business

The International Business major helps prepare graduates to understand and deal with the challenges facing firms conducting business in an increasingly global business environment. Students graduating with a Bachelor of Business (International Business) will be well placed to seek employment with domestic and multinational corporations, government organisations, non-profit organisations and international organisations across the manufacturing and service sector, where a broad knowledge of international business is required.

Career opportunities

This major prepares graduates for a generalist or specialist career in most organisations, and in particular those operating in the international arena. Career opportunities exist in multinational companies, government departments, investment and financial institutions, import and export companies, and international organisations.

Management and Leadership

Major in Management and Leadership if you wish to become an excellent manager. In this major, you learn about topic areas, such as managing organisations, organisational behaviour and management, leadership, people development, knowledge management, international management, leading organisational change and business strategy.

Career opportunities

Management roles are available in a wide range of public and private enterprise.

Marketing

This major provides opportunities for students to learn relevant marketing theories and principles in a real-world context through the use of case studies and applied activities. Students who graduate with a Marketing major will be well equipped to work as a practising marketer in a range of both product and service industries, and they will have an appreciation for the global, sustainable and ethical contextualisation of both marketing strategies and practices.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates include: marketing consultant, marketing researcher, advertising manager, product or brand manager, distribution manager, and sales manager.

Marketing and Hospitality Management

This major provides a unique combination of USQ program delivery with recognition of TAFE qualifications. Upon successful completion of this joint delivery dual award program, students will receive two qualifications, a Diploma of Hospitality from TAFE and a Bachelor of Business (Marketing and Hospitality Management) from USQ. The USQ component of the program will provide understanding of marketing theories and principles. Student knowledge in the field of management is further developed through human resource and management courses. Tertiary-trained graduates from this program will be well positioned to fill supervisory and executive positions.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates include: hotel manager, resort manager, hospitality manager, catering manager, tourism manager, events manager, marketing manager.

Supply Chain Management

The Supply Chain Management major focuses on planning, organising and controlling the flow of material and information within and between organisations. The major combines supply chain design, logistics management, distribution channels, supply chain operations and quality management to provide students with the required knowledge and skills to pursue careers within the production and service industry, as well as consultancies.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates include: production manager, purchasing manager, planning and scheduling officer, supply chain manager, inventory manager, distribution manager, and warehouse manager.

Tourism Management

Tourism Management is designed to provide a relevant professional education for students seeking management careers in a particularly diverse and dynamic tourism industry. The program is structured around a core of foundation business courses, field-specific courses and elective courses, and includes a blend of theoretical and applied courses. An increasing number of employers in the industry now prefer tertiary-trained graduates to fill supervisory and executive positions.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates include: ecotourism project manager, tourism researcher, tourism marketing manager, cultural tourism manager, events coordinator, ecotourism guide, cultural tourism liaison officer, tourism research officer, regional tourism coordinator, owner/manager, hospitality manager, restaurant and functions supervisor, and public relations officer.

Tourism and Events Management

This major provides a unique combination of USQ program delivery with recognition of TAFE qualifications. Upon successful completion of this joint delivery dual award program, students will receive two qualifications, a Diploma of Events from TAFE and a Bachelor of Business (Tourism and Events Management) from USQ.

Tourism and Events Management is designed to provide a relevant professional education for students seeking management careers in a particularly diverse and dynamic tourism and events industry. The program is structured around a core of foundation business courses, field-specific courses and elective courses, and includes a blend of theoretical and applied courses. Graduates of this major will be well-equipped with tourism and events management skills and knowledge to assist the tourism and events industries to establish and grow a sustainable future.

Program focus

The Bachelor of Business Administration equips students with an understanding of the competitive environment in which private and public sector organisations operate, and provide students with the analytical and operational skills to resolve business problems in both sectors. The program provides flexibility to study areas of particular interest. The option of studying three minors prepares students for a range of careers in both the public and private sectors. Students receive a foundation in all aspects of business, with the flexibility to develop more than one area of experience.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Graduating students have opportunities for careers within public or private sector national or global organisations. The structure of the program provides graduates with the knowledge and skills to be effective in a wide range of careers, such as human resource management and leadership, marketing, finance, international business or general business.

Bachelor of Commerce

Duration 3 years full-time, up to 6 years part-time

Mode of study On-campus¹, distance education

Campus Toowoomba, Springfield, Fraser Coast

Program focus

The Bachelor of Commerce is a career-oriented degree which provides a sound foundation in all aspects of commerce.

ACCOUNTING

This major provides students with a broad knowledge-base in financial accounting, management accounting, business law and finance. Second majors or minors are available in a range of Business, Commerce and Arts areas.

Career opportunities

Graduates of this major can expect careers, including: public accountant, chartered accountant, company accountant, company secretary, financial administrator, government (tax department, audit office, treasury, local government), financial planner, investment adviser, financial institutions (banks, building societies), and forensic accountant.

BUSINESS LAW

The Business Law major is designed to provide students with an appreciation of the legal framework within which commerce and business operate. Students will develop skills in detailed examination of facts, analysis of statutory provision, marshalling of arguments based on legal principles, and communication.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates of this major include: legal studies teacher (with further study), public service, company secretary, government departments, non-government agencies, and legal organisations and careers outside law.

FINANCE

This major provides students with knowledge of financial environments and modern analytical techniques. Students learn to understand a broad range of finance areas, including business finance, stockbroking, investment management, international financial management and financial economics. Graduates will be equipped for a career in stockbroking, financial services and business. Second majors or minors are available in a range of Business, Commerce and Arts areas.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities for graduates of this major include: financial services, banker, insurance, financial planner, financial adviser, funds manager, financial analyst, industrial analyst, investment analyst, investment banker, security analyst, underwriter, options/futures trader, treasury, foreign exchange trader/officer, share trader, lending officer, finance officer, corporate or policy adviser, business consultant, research officer, and business economist.

GENERAL COMMERCE

The General Commerce major provides students with a broader commerce degree. It is ideal if students want a solid foundation in commerce, but are not seeking membership of a professional body. The flexibility of the program means students can tailor their study to specific areas of interest.

Career opportunities

Graduates will be equipped for careers, such as: financial analyst, financial planning, investment banker, financial accountant, forensic accountant, stockbroker, and in small business management.

SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS

This major provides students with a broad base of knowledge relevant to sustainable business, including environmental studies, biodiversity, conservation, environmental law, sustainable economies, sustainable business, and sustainable accounting and finance.

Career opportunities

This major complements the Accounting major, providing accounting graduates with knowledge and expertise in sustainable business practices, management accounting, financial reporting and economic analysis.

WHAT DOES UNIVERSITY STUDY COST?

There are two main costs incurred for university study: program fees and textbook purchase.

Program fees

Commonwealth supported places are available for Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens (resident in Australia) and Australian permanent residents (resident in Australia). Students are required to pay the Student Contribution Amount associated with these places. The Student Contribution Amount is charged per course/per semester. Additional places which are not supported by the Australian Government may be available; however, these places will incur full tuition fees.

Fee assistance for undergraduate study

The Higher Education Loan Program (HELP) is a package of loans available to help students pay their Student Contribution Amount or full tuition. It includes:

- HECS-HELP for eligible students paying Student Contribution Amount
- FEE-HELP for eligible students paying full tuition fees
- OS-HELP for eligible students who want to study overseas.

HECS-HELP

HECS-HELP is a loan that helps eligible Commonwealth supported students to pay their Student Contribution Amount. It is available to Australian citizens and students holding permanent humanitarian visas only. The Student Contribution Amount varies according to the courses studied at USQ. Eligible students can choose to pay some or all of their Student Contribution Amount up-front, or they can access a HECS-HELP loan to cover some or all of this charge. HECS-HELP enables students to commence repayment via the tax system when their income reaches a certain level.

Students who are eligible for HECS-HELP assistance receive a 20 percent discount on up-front payments of \$500 or more. To determine whether a program is Commonwealth supported, refer to the program summary in the USQ Handbook: www.usq.edu.au/handbook

FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is a loan of up to a Government approved balance that helps eligible full-tuition – paying students pay their tuition fees. FEE-HELP is available to Australian citizens and students holding permanent humanitarian visas only. Eligible students may pay some or all of their tuition fees upfront, or they may request a FEE-HELP loan to cover some or all of their tuition fees. Students accessing FEE-HELP for undergraduate study will pay a 20 percent loan fee. Full tuition fees vary according to the discipline studied at USQ.

OS-HELP

OS-HELP is a loan that assists eligible Commonwealth supported students undertake some of their undergraduate study overseas. These loans are designed to help students with a range of expenses, such as airfares and accommodation. Australian citizens and students holding permanent humanitarian visas may be eligible for an OS-HELP loan. USQ has a limited number of OS-HELP loans available for eligible students. Each loan of up to \$5523 (indexed annually) is for a six-month study period. Students may access a second loan for a further six-month period under certain circumstances. OS-HELP is not available in the first year or final semester.

International students

If you are not an Australian citizen, a New Zealand citizen or the holder of an Australian permanent resident visa, you are required to pay international student fees. For further information, please contact USQ International, or refer to USQ International's website: www.usq.edu.au/international. HELP loans are not available to international students.

Textbooks and other expenses

The cost of books, stationery and other supplies will vary, according to the courses you study. Students are usually expected to have their own textbooks. Reference books are available from the library or can be sent via the library post service if you are a distance education student. The USQ Bookshop sells all new textbooks needed for USQ courses. The bookshop also sells software, calculators and stationery. Textbooks cost about \$300 to \$500 a semester for a full-time student if purchased new; second-hand textbooks are available through the Student Guild. Additional costs may apply for some programs, e.g. uniforms and special equipment required for Nursing.

SCHOLARSHIPS

If you are considering attending university in the near future, a USQ scholarship can help you achieve your academic potential by allowing you to concentrate on your studies.

We offer more than 100 scholarships to students who have demonstrated academic excellence, leadership and participation in the wider community. Scholarships are also available to students whose ability to attend university and achieve their full academic potential is affected by financial hardship. There are scholarships for mature-age students who are returning to study; and others for students heading to university from school or TAFE. Students who are half-way through their degree and have demonstrated a high level of academic merit at USQ can also apply for scholarships to help them finish their studies.

We offer a wide range of scholarships

We offer scholarships for on-campus study, distance study, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, international students, as well as Government-funded scholarships and Equity scholarships for eligible applicants. We encourage all of our applicants to apply for scholarships; it is important to address the selection criteria fully and provide supporting evidence to give yourself the best chance of success. HOW TO APPLY

QTAC

In most instances, applications for undergraduate programs should be made through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC). QTAC's role is to provide a centralised application system for Queensland tertiary institutions.

Current Year 12 students

Domestic applicants for undergraduate programs at USQ should apply via QTAC. Students completing Year 12 in 2011 should apply to QTAC via the *Twelve-to-Tertiary* online application service at: www.qtac.edu.au

Non-Year 12 applicants

To gain entry to USQ, it is not necessary to have completed Year 12 or to have any formal academic qualifications.

Alternative entry enables you to demonstrate your capacity to undertake tertiary study on the basis of the following:

- professional and post-secondary qualification
- employment experience
- Personal Competencies Assessment (PCA)
- results in the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT).

Please note: if you are applying via alternative entry, you are required to satisfy minimum entry requirements, such as subject pre-requisites, interviews, or auditions.

Direct entry

Whilst some applicants have the option to apply directly to USQ (as outlined below), the Bachelor of Education (Technical & Vocational Education) and Bachelor of Vocational Education & Training require all applicants to directly apply to USQ for entry.

You can apply online and attach scanned certified copies of any required supporting documentation with your application. For anyone without access to a computer, there are direct entry forms available.

Queensland TAFE

If you have completed a Queensland TAFE qualification that is listed under the articulation agreement between Queensland TAFE and USQ, then you can apply directly to USQ and receive credit towards your degree.

MODES OF STUDY
