Your Key Responsibilities

Academic Student Representatives play a vital role in bridging the gap between students and the University and have several important responsibilities:

- 1. Regularly attend and actively engage in the committee meetings and ongoing conversations.
- 2. Provide regular updates to the committee (i.e. via written report or where appropriate verbal) on matters such as the degree, course modules, learning environment, resources and teaching methods
- 3. Gather the opinions and views of students on all matters relating to learning, teaching and the student experience through coordination of student feedback sessions and forums.
- 4. Provide both positive and negative feedback to staff and fellow students and work with staff to identify appropriate solutions.
- 5. As a member of the University community, demonstrate the highest possible standards of professional and personal conduct, both as an individual and as part of a team; commit to regular engagement in personal, professional and team development; and demonstrate behaviour consistent with the key capabilities outlined in the USQ People Capability Framework.
