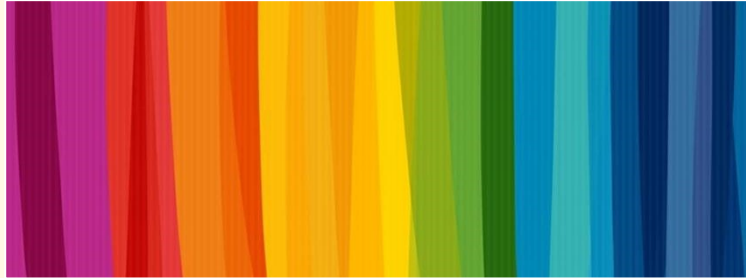

Same-sex marriage postal survey: 'Love has had a landslide victory' as 'yes' wins

Australians have emphatically voted in favour of legalising same-sex marriage, saying 'yes' to the historic social change by a substantial margin of 61.6 per cent to 38.4 per cent. Germany to recognise third gender for intersex people

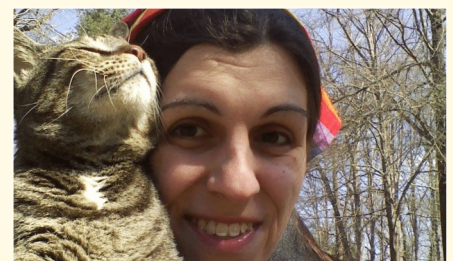
Germany's top court has ruled that there must be the option of registering a gender that is neither male nor female on birth certificates. It would make Germany the first European country to allow parents to designate their intersex offspring as a third gender. 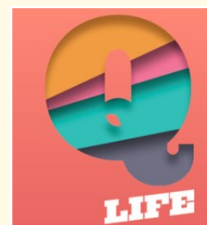
